18th & 19th September 2026

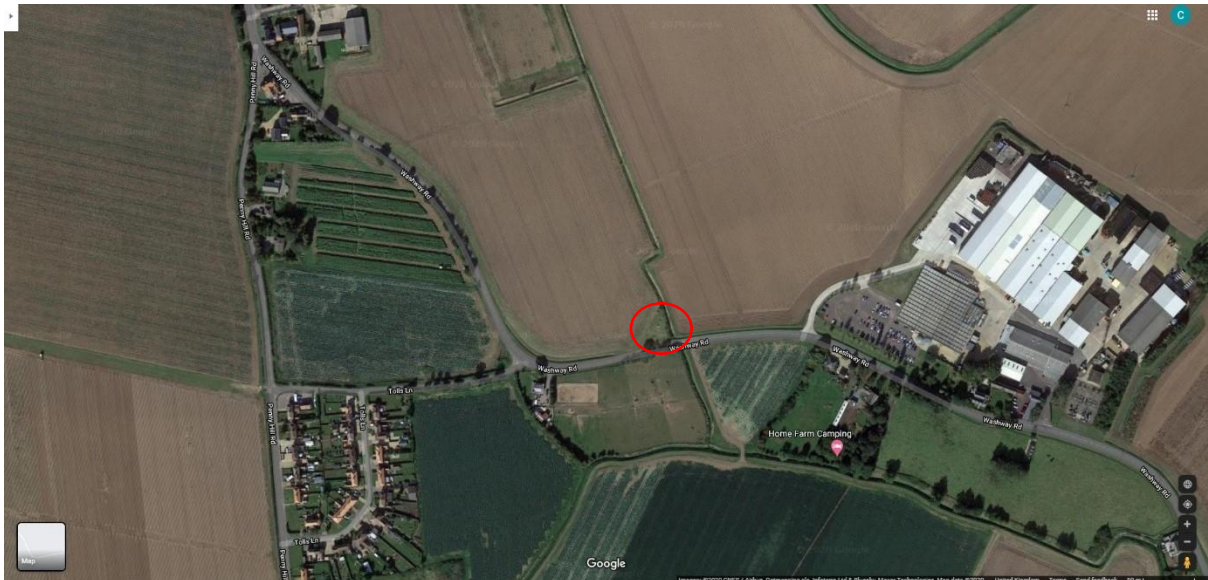

Thank you for signing up to our Heritage Open Days tour and talk on the Holbeach Group ROC Post. Please read the following information to ensure a safe and enjoyable visit.

Location:

The bunker is located just off the Washway Road in Spalding. The easiest way to find it is to search for O.A. Taylor & Sons Bulbs, as it is just down the road from there. Their postcode is PE12 7PP, however please don't actually enter their site. Parking for the bunker is on the road next to the post. We will have a red marquee and bunting up, so the event should be easy to spot. Please take care when parking along the roadside, and if crossing the road to reach the event. Self-Declaration of Medical Fitness:

On arrival to the event, we will ask you if you wish to go down into the bunker. The room itself is fairly small and enclosed and requires you to descend and ascend a 9ft ladder to access. For this reason, the bunker is not suitable for anyone with medical conditions which may be affected by this, including but not limited to:

Asthma or shortness of breath	Nervous disorders
Epilepsy or blackouts	Back or disc related problems
High / low blood pressure	Mobility problems
Hand injuries or weakness	Claustrophobia
Heart related problems	Balance problems

If this does not apply to you and you still wish to enter the bunker, you will need to complete a self declaration of medical fitness before you may access the underground post.

If you cannot or do not wish to access the post, the majority of the tour will be taking place on the surface, and actually seeing the room itself will make up only a very small part of the experience.

General Safety Precautions We Need You to Take:

- The site is mostly grassy, but uneven in some places. Please come dressed for the weather wearing suitable footwear, especially if you wish to enter the bunker.
- We will ask you to complete a self-declaration of medical fitness before you may access the underground post. This is because the bunker is difficult to access for emergency services and may delay their response in the case of someone having a medical emergency whilst in the bunker. You must be able to enter and exit the bunker via the 9ft ladder without assistance.
- Dogs are welcome but must be on a lead. They will need to stay above ground with a member of your family group if you decide to enter the bunker.
- Please note: no smoking anywhere on the site is allowed including the use of ecigarettes.
